Contraceptive services are legally available to **ALL people under 18 in Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Washington, D.C., Georgia, Idaho, Iowa, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Montana, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Virginia, Washington, and Wyoming; **ALL people 14 and older** in Hawaii; and **SOME people under 18** in Alabama, Connecticut, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Oklahoma, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Vermont, and West Virginia.*

*The following states do not have an explicit policy on whether people **under 18** have the authority to consent to contraceptive services: North Dakota, Ohio, Rhode Island, and Wisconsin.*

Physicians may (but are not required to) inform a young person's parents about their use of contraception in Delaware, Hawaii, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Minnesota, Montana, Oklahoma, and Oregon. ¹
